

2020 JD and LLMCL Summer Program

The Summer Program at Allard Hall is open to current (registered in 2019W) UBC JD and current and new LLMCL students only. It is **not** open to NCA or students who are not enrolled at the Allard School of Law.

JD students are advised that participation in the Summer Program courses is contingent on satisfactory completion of the 2019W session, and students may be withdrawn from summer courses in May as a result of their 2019W academic performance. Additionally, students with April deferred exams may not be able to participate in the summer session courses.

Grading - Summer 2020 courses will not be graded Credit/D/Fail.

- Time Commitment:
 - Rise Women’s Legal Centre is open to the public from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm, Monday to Friday, and closed on statutory holidays. Students are generally expected to be at Rise Monday through Thursday between 9:00 am and 5:00 pm. Student are not required to be at Rise on Fridays; *we strongly encourage students to use Fridays away from Rise to work on the graded written components of the Reflections course.*
 - The three-week orientation session is mandatory. It begins Monday, May 4, 2020 and runs Monday to Friday. After orientation, students will attend three-hour seminars generally scheduled to take place on Thursday afternoons. The seminars will be held at Rise. Other required activities may also be scheduled during the term.

Students registered for LAW 491.001 (LSLAP) in the summer are only allowed to be registered in one additional course per term in the summer.

LAW 491.001 Law Students Legal Advice Program (6 credits) – Chris Heslinga

- Dates: May 4 – August 7
- Restricted to a limited number of upper year students who (a) in their first or second year have participated in the provision of legal services to the public through the Law Students Legal Advice Program, and (b) continue that participation in their second or third year. Credit will be granted for only one of LAW 488, LAW 490, or LAW 491. Registration by permission only. Students may not self-register. - Update as of May 19, 2020: It is now too late to register for LAW 491.001 (LSLAP for credit) for Summer 2020, as training has already started.

JD LOAN AND BURSARY ELIGIBILITY

If you are planning to take courses during the summer session and would like to be eligible for full-time government student loans, make sure you meet the following requirements.

- Register in at least 9 credits (or 6 credits if approved for PD status); and
- Register in at least 12 consecutive weeks of course work; and
- Ensure that there is a break of no longer than 8 consecutive business days between courses (the gap between the last day of class and the final exam for the same course is not counted as a break in studies)

If you are registering in the JD classes offered in both terms of the summer session AND are registered in a minimum of 9 credits during this period (or 6 credits if approved for PD status), then you will meet the course load requirements for full-time student loans.

Apply for your loan using the 2019/20 application, which should currently be available for all provinces. Generally, processing time is 4-6 weeks, depending on your home province, so it is important that you apply early.

If you are going to apply for a summer loan, also be sure to apply for UBC Summer Bursary through the SSC. The application opens on May 1 and will close on June 1. Only those students who meet the general bursary criteria will be considered for summer bursary.

To be considered for bursary support, you must:

- be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident or landed immigrant
- apply for the UBC Bursary program by the deadline
- be receiving full-time government student loans during the same session that you are applying for bursary support
- have your enrolment confirmed for your student loans by the bursary deadline.
- have an assessed financial unmet need
- be enrolled in an eligible program with a full-time [course load](#).

To make sure your student loan is confirmed by the bursary deadline, we strongly recommend that you apply for your student loan by April 1st for Summer Session bursaries.
