About the Director

Dr. Liao was appointed Director of the Centre for Business Law in August 2019. She is an Associate Professor at the Peter A. Allard School of Law and the UBC Sauder Distinguished Scholar of the Peter P. Dhillon Centre for Business Ethics, UBC Sauder School of Business. An award-winning teacher and researcher, Dr. Liao is also a Principal co-Investigator of the Canada Climate Law Initiative and a former Bertram Scholar of the Institute of Corporate Directors. She obtained her PhD/SJD (Joint Degree) from UBC and the University of Toronto, specializing in corporate law. Prior to academia, she was a senior associate in the Mergers & Acquisitions Group of Shearman & Sterling LLP in New York and clerked at the BC Court of Appeal.

As I reflect on my time as Director of the Centre for Business Law, I am proud of our accomplishments during the most unusual 2020 year.

We have reinvigorated a dynamic research centre that provides a community of over 3,000 business leaders, practitioners, scholars, and students with access to legal education and networking events year around. In the past 15 months, we have hosted 38 events on a wide range of contemporary business topics including Indigenous business, cannabis law, pay equity, mining governance, climate litigation, access to justice, and post-pandemic green recovery, to name a few.

We have fostered and developed new educational programs housed at the Centre, and also established our inaugural Student Committee, which hosted its first lawyer-student luncheon in March of this year.





In July 2019, Dr. Maziar Peihani was appointed to the Lawson Lundell UBC Professorship of Business Law. His teaching and research focuses on financial and business law, specifically banking regulation, resolution of cross-border bank failures, sovereign debt restructuring, and disclosure and governance of climate-related financial risks.

Prior to joining Allard Law, Dr. Peihani was a Senior Fellow at the Hennick Centre for Business and Law, Research Fellow at the National University of Singapore, and was the lead in-house expert on international financial law at the Centre for International Governance Innovation. He also served as a member of the Task Force on International Financial Architecture for Stability and Development, an advisory to the G20 Argentine Presidency.


