

# RISE WOMEN'S LEGAL CENTRE 2024-2025 Application Fact Sheet

Note: This document provides information regarding the application process for a 2024-2025 position with Rise. For additional information regarding Rise, please see their Program Description on the <u>Allard Law Clinics and Externships webpage</u>.

## 1. Application Package

Students must include	the followin	g materials in	their ar	plication	package:

- (a) ⊠ Resume
- (b) ☐ Cover Letter
- (c) ⊠ Completion of the Mandatory Experiential Application Survey
- (d) ⊠ Contact information for 2 references to be included in the Mandatory Experiential Application Survey
- (e) ☑ Other: the Rise Application Form found on the <u>Allard Law Clinics and Externships</u> webpage.

Please see the <u>Allard Law Clinics and Externships webpage</u> for additional guidance on preparing these materials. All application package materials should be submitted via <u>ACE</u>. All experiential opportunities are labelled "ExL 2024 - 2025: Clinic Name" on ACE.

#### 2. Grades

Rise will review the following grades in their recruitment process:

- (a) ⊠ Law school grades that are available up to the date of the Application Deadline will be reviewed
- (b) ☐ Law school grades will NOT be reviewed

## **If Option A is Selected:**

Students must include a copy of their Allard Law Transcript in their application package.

- i. ☐ The Transcript must be an official copy (Note: There is a cost associated with ordering a Transcript. Transcripts can take 2-4 business days to process.)
- ii. 

  The Transcript does not need to be an official copy. A PDF of the Grades Summary generated through the Student Service Centre is sufficient (Note: The Grades Summary does not list course titles).

### If Option B is Selected:

Rise will not receive access to students' law school grades. A student who <u>only</u> applies to Rise and does not apply to any other Allard Law experiential learning program that collects grades (including upper-year moot programs), will not have their law school grades collected or distributed to any experiential learning programs.

## 4. Compatibility with Upper-Year Moot Programs

- (a)  $\square$  Students may participate in a moot and Rise in the same academic year.
- (b) ⊠ Students may <u>not</u> participate in a moot and Rise in the same academic year.
   However, students in Term 1 Rise may participate in the Kawaskimhon Moot in Term 2.

NOTE: In addition to the above notations, students cannot take any other courses (including other experiential learning opportunities) during their Rise term.

## 5. Program Schedule Overview

Students are responsible for managing their time and are expected to be fully engaged while participating in the program. Students should plan their affairs accordingly given the program schedule below:

Our Fall and Spring exact program dates will be announced later in Summer of 2024; and will run during the typical term dates at Allard Law. The clinic is a full-term 15 credit program and takes place entirely on-site at the Rise head office located in downtown Vancouver at 516 Richards Street. The semester starts with a ~3.5 week orientation, during which time students are expected to be in-office from Monday-Friday. For the remainder of the term, students are expected to be in-office Monday-Thursday, and may use Friday to work on the seminar course requirements.

\*\*Please note that grades are only one small part of our consideration of applications. We encourage applications from all interested students.



## ADDITIONAL INFORMATION RE: GRADES COLLECTION AND DISTRIBUTION

1. Do I need to include my law school grades in my application?

All clinics and externships have their own application requirements that are set out in their fact sheets. Students should carefully review each program's fact sheet to determine whether law school grades are required to apply.

2. I did not apply for a program that requires grades. Who will get access to my grades?

If you did <u>NOT</u> apply to any experiential learning program that requires grades, your grades will not be provided to any experiential learning programs.

3. I have concerns about providing my law school grades to an experiential learning program. What should I do?

Grades are only one component of application packages. Often, grades are just used by a program as a source of additional information about a student's interest in an area of law or as a general indication of their academic progression. You do not need to have exceptional grades to be considered a strong applicant.
