



GUIDELINES FOR CENTRE FOR ASIAN LEGAL STUDIES (CAL S) VISITING SCHOLARS

The following are guidelines for Visiting Scholars to the Centre for Asian Legal Studies (CAL S)

1. CAL S accepts Visiting Scholars as follows:
 - a. Visiting Scholars who will collaborate with CAL S members
 - b. Distinguished Scholars who can contribute to UBC and CAL S, with the approval of the hosting faculty members
 - c. Other Researchers and Scholars whose research profiles are determined to be in the interest of CAL S
 - d. Judges and practitioners who are recommended based on institutional arrangements and follow the regular applications procedure

Applicants in categories c and d are required to find an appropriate supervisor to supervise their research.

2. All applicants are required to submit a research plan. In addition to the summary of research plan, applicants must submit the following
 - a. Research Objectives (state your research objective/goal to be achieved by the visit. Highlight any value and contributions of your research to the academia or for practice)
 - b. A Literature Review (state briefly what kind of material you have read to prepare for your research)
 - c. Timeline of Research (state the various stages and plans for progress)
 - d. Prospective Research Outcomes (state the intended outcome of your research)
 - e. Possible Avenue of sharing or publishing research outcomes (state how you plan to publish, share and present your research to the academia)
3. Before leaving UBC, all Visiting Scholars are required to submit a report on research outcomes

4. All Visiting Scholars are required to contribute to and engage with the Allard community by giving a lunchtime talk, participating in a symposium, submitting blog posts or participating in class discussions.
5. All Visiting Scholars are required to share or publish their research outcomes in some form during or after the visit.
