WHY MOOT?



- Develop Practical Legal Skills: Intensive training in legal research, written and oral advocacy
- Mentorship and Support: Learn from esteemed faculty and legal practitioners
- Build a Legal Network: Travel to other provinces or countries to meet and compete against other law schools' moot teams
- Practice Teamwork Skills: Work with other Allard Law students to represent your client



EXPERIENTIAL REQUIREMENT



All JD students must complete one (1) experiential course or program prior to graduation. This is met in second or third year through the completion of either:

Credit-bearing clinical program

Upper-year moot

Course approved as meeting the Experiential requirement

COURSE PLANNING



- Credit Cap: Students are limited to 20 credits of clinical and upper-year mooting credits
 - UY Moots range from 3-5 credits
 - Clinics range from 6-15 credits
- Compatibility w/ Clinic: some clinics and moots cannot be taken within the same term, or within the same year
- Pre or co-requisite courses: some moots have pre or corequisite courses

APPLICATION PROCESS



- Students must apply to participate in an upper year moot
- Deadline to Apply: 11:59pm, May 20, 2024
- Apply by completing 2 actions by the deadline:
 - For each moot, prepare your application materials according to the moot's application fact sheet and submit it on ACE
 - Fill out the Mandatory Moot Application Online Survey
 - Do this last!
 - Do this once!



APPLICATION MATERIALS



- Review the relevant Application Fact Sheet to determine what you need to prepare in your application materials
- Try-Outs: 7 minute presentation on a specified topic in front of 1 or more judges
 - Calendly sign-up link and try out schedule will be posted on the UY Moots webpage (link goes live at 12:30pm, March 1)
 - You only need to try out once. Your tryout is recorded. You do not need to try out separately for each moot.



HOW TO PREPARE FOR TRYOUT



- Consider both sides of the argument
- Take the time to develop your argument
- Do not focus on legal research do not bring in written materials for the judges to review
- Practice, practice and don't sweat the small stuff!
