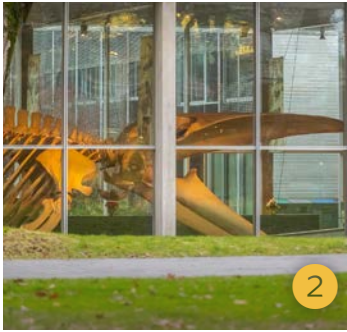

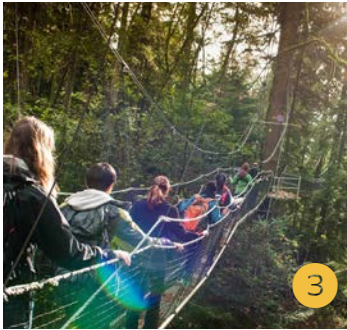
Attractions at UBC

AHVA Gallery

The AHVA contemporary art gallery within the Audain Art Centre hosts free exhibits, lectures and performances by UBC Art History, Visual Art and Theory (AHVA) students, as well as faculty and visiting artists. Exhibitions vary throughout the year. ¹



Beaty Biodiversity Museum

The Beaty Biodiversity Museum is Vancouver's only natural history museum and is home to over two million specimens, as well as a spectacular blue whale skeleton—25 metres long. The rest of the museum—over 20,000 square feet—is underground, hidden beneath a green roof, one of the building's many innovative sustainability features.

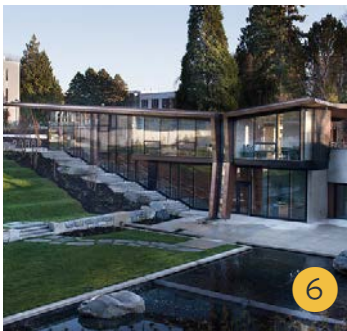

UBC Botanical Gardens

Established in 1916, UBC Botanical Garden includes 12,000 plants from around the world, spread over 44 hectares, and is part of UBC's Faculty of Science. Highlights include an Asian Garden, Food Garden, B.C. Rainforest Garden, the Greenheart Canopy Walkway aerial system and more. If you have a green thumb, be sure to stop by the Plant Centre, which sells native and rare specimens.

Indian Residential School History and Dialogue Centre

Between the late 1800s and 1996, approximately 150,000 Indigenous children were forced to attend residential schools run by the Government of Canada in collaboration with church organizations. These children were taken from their families, removing them from their languages, lands and cultures. Visitors are welcome to browse the exhibit and use the interactive display to learn more about the legacy of residential schools in Canada. Closed on weekends.

The Irving K. Barber Learning Centre (IKBLC)

The iconic IKBLC features contemporary art exhibits as well as the permanent Chung Collection, which highlights early immigration from China to BC. You'll find First Nations carvings and weavings throughout the Centre, and portraits of UBC presidents and chancellors in the Ridington Reading Room. The building is also home to UBC Library's Rare Books and Special Collections.

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Morris and Helen Belkin Art Gallery

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Pacific Spirit Regional Park

A paradise for nature lovers of all ages and abilities, Pacific Spirit Regional Park rings UBC's Vancouver campus with lush rainforest trails. The 90-hectare park has almost 75 kilometres of walking and hiking

paths — 50 kilometres of which are designated multi-use and available for cycling (even horseback riding!). ¹²

UBC Rose Garden

A feast for the senses with stunning ocean and mountain views, and more than a dozen types of roses. The garden is the perfect place to snap a souvenir photo or linger over a picnic lunch. *Free.* ¹³

STOPS OF INTEREST ALONG THE WAY

UBC Bookstore. Souvenirs, UBC swag, art supplies, and (of course) books. Get it all here. ¹⁴

Martha Piper Plaza. Named after one of UBC's former presidents, the height of the fountain water lets students know how much time is left until class starts—the shorter the spouting water, the closer they're cutting it! ¹⁵

The **Musqueam Post**, carved by Brent Sparrow Jr., welcomes people to campus and is a reminder of UBC's relationship with the Musqueam whose history predates the university by thousands of years. ¹⁶

The **Reconciliation Pole** was installed in April of 2017 to commemorate the history of Indigenous people in Canada before, during, and after the Indian residential school era. ¹⁷
