## **Abstract**

Gareth Higgins was born in Belfast in 1975 and grew up during the Northern Ireland Troubles. He now divides his time between Northern Ireland and the US. Gareth writes and speaks about the power of storytelling to shape our lives and world, peacemaking and justice, and how to take life seriously without believing your own propaganda. He has been involved in peacebuilding and violence reduction in Northern Ireland and helping address legacies of conflict. Gareth has a Ph.D. in Sociology from Queen's University Belfast and helped teach the world's first graduate course in Reconciliation Studies at Trinity College Dublin. He also helped found the *Wild Goose*, *New Story* and *Movies & Meaning* festivals. Gareth leads retreats in North America and Ireland and founded *The Porch Magazine*.
